


## Evaluation of Scaling the New Orleans Charter Restart Model: Student Impact John McDonogh: Future Is Now Cohort 2, New Orleans, LA

### Enrollment & Demographic Profile

John McDonogh: Future is Now operated for only two years. In its second year the percentage of Hispanic students and the percentage of English-Language Learners increased. John McDonogh reported no free/reduced price lunch-eligible students in 2013-14, although we suspect this is a reporting error. Demographic data are provided for only those years during which John McDonogh: Future is Now was included in the CRM evaluation.

### PMO Score

### School Proficiency Level

The Performance Management Organization (PMO) score is a composite index of implementation quality. The PMO is built around 14 functions that effective schools have mastered. In each of the 14 areas, school personnel responses and field researcher observations were rated and compiled. Final scores were calculated as follows:

Rubric Score	PMO Stage
0	Absent
100	Developing
200	Accomplished
300	Exemplary

As an indicator of overall student achievement, we provide information regarding CRM students' performance on state standardized tests in reading and math. These data are publicly available from the Louisiana Department of Education. For each year of school operation, we report the percentage of students attending John McDonogh: Future is Now achieving proficiency or above on Louisiana's state tests in both reading and math.

### Implementation Summary

The installation of Future Is Now as the operator of John McDonogh was flawed from selection onward. FIN had no track record, no local presence in New Orleans, and no clearly defined pedagogical model going into the turnaround of an infamously unsafe and low-performing high school. FIN appointed a principal who did not meet NSNO's criteria for leadership and who operated as a contractor rather than making a full-time commitment to John McDonogh. The installation of a reality television crew in the school to document the turnaround created unconscionable disruption to school culture and the learning environment. Student needs (academic and social-emotional) went unaddressed from John McDonogh's inception. The school closed after only two years of operation.

### School's Current Status

John McDonogh ceased to operate after the 2013-14 school year. Future Is Now no longer exists as an organization.
