



Because Wilson Charter School was included in the CRM evaluation for only one year, we do not present demographic trends. In 2015-16, Wilson Charter School enrolled a lower percentage of Black students and a higher percentage of students eligible for free/reduced price lunch relative to citywide averages.

PMO Score

The Performance Management Organization (PMO) score is a composite index of implementation quality. The PMO is built around 14 functions that effective schools have mastered. In each of the 14 areas, school personnel responses and field researcher observations were rated and compiled. Final scores were calculated as follows:

Implementation Summary

Wilson was the last CRM school in New Orleans, coming online in the final year of the evaluation. As such, we have limited Implementation data for this school. Most notable about Wilson within the evaluation is the way their selection process occurred. The Closing school was a non-network charter with an active board and a RSD parents group. When the school was slated for closure, an RSD parent group and parent advocates identified multiple potential operators, rather than pre-selecting an operator as per earlier selection rounds. Stakeholders came to agreement on InspireNOLA in a process that typified authentic community engagement for the first time in the CRM.

School's Current Status

Wilson continues to serve grades K through 8 under their CRM operator, InspireNOLA. Their performance and accountability clock restarted with the takeover in 2015-16, so they have no official state performance rating yet. However, their preliminary school performance scores as determined by LDE indicate that Wilson performs as a "C" school with a slight upward trajectory from 2015-16 to 2016-17.
